

PLACE NAMES IN COUNTRIES OF THE FORMER YUGOSLAVIA

This document deals with name changes which have taken place since the break-up of Yugoslavia in 1991. It supersedes the earlier PCGN document *Countries of the Former Yugoslavia: Place Names* dated January 1996.

Genuine name changes, approved by the official governing body of the country concerned, are listed for each individual country. Settlements for which variant unofficial names may be encountered are also listed where names may have been applied by unofficial parties.

The category of alternative ethnic forms of place names within Serbia (Hungarian names in Vojvodina and Albanian names in Kosovo) is not included in this document.

Bosnia and Herzegovina

Bosnia and Herzegovina consists of two entities: the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (Muslim/Croat) and the Republika Srpska (Serb). Some settlements in Republika Srpska now possess, in *de facto* terms at least, Serbian names which differ from those officially sanctioned by Sarajevo prior to the Dayton agreement of 1995. These *de facto* names are listed in the second column below, shown in brackets to reflect their status subordinate to that of the official names in the first column. Any portrayal of these *de facto* names on official products should reflect this subordinate status.
